**Elections**

2/5/16 – 6:30 am, 7:30 am, 8:30 am & 5:06 pm – A 60-second story aired regarding a debate between the two candidates for District Attorney

2/5/16 – 5:06 pm – A 60-second story aired concerning the hire of a new elections administrator.

2/5/16 – 6:40 am-7:00 am – A 20 minute presentation aired highlighting the candidates for local office.

2/8/16 – 6:30 am, 7:30 am, 8:30 am – A 60-second story aired concerning the hire of a new elections administrator.

**Crime**

3/7/16 – 5:06 pm – A 30-second story aired detailing how the Sheriff's office located a stolen car, and arrested the driver and passenger on drug charges as well as charges of unauthorized use of a motor vehicle.

3/11/16 – 6:30 am, 7:30 am, 8:30 am & 5:06 pm – A 60-second story aired about the punishment phase of a former Brownwood Middle School coach convicted of inappropriate relationship between an educator and a student.

**Poverty**
